BACKGROUND CHECK REQUIREMENTS

To meet diocesan policy, the following background checks are required for volunteers:

- · BCI (Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation) background check required for all volunteers.
- FBI background check in addition to BCI, FBI is required for volunteers who have lived outside the state of Ohio at any point in the past five years.

If you currently volunteer, or plan to volunteer in the future, we warmly encourage you to check that your VIRTUS account is active and up to date, and that your background checks have been completed within the required timeframes.



ST. JOHN NEUMANN RECEIVES GRANTS FROM THE CATHOLIC FOUNDATION


We have been blessed to receive two grants in the current Responsive Grants Cycle distributed by The Catholic Foundation this year.

Little Liturgical Lessons

Progressive? At Mass? It's More Likely Than You Think!

In the rhythm of Catholic worship, not all celebrations are created equal. Some days call for incense and chant; others for quiet simplicity. The principle known as *progressive solemnity* helps the Church navigate this spectrum, offering a structured way to scale the solemnity of our celebrations. This principle reveals how tradition and pastoral sensitivity converge in our Church's worship. It helps to guide how the Church modulates the celebration of Mass based on the importance of the day, the season of the year, our community and available resources.

While the concept of varying levels of solemnity has ancient roots—evident in the Middle Ages and the Roman Rite's distinctions between Low, High, and Solemn Masses—it was only in the 20th century that the term "progressive solemnity" gained traction. The principle was first mentioned in Church documents following the Second Vatican Council, such as *Musicam Sacram* (1967), the Instruction on Music in the Liturgy issued by what was then the Sacred Congregation of Rites. *Musicam Sacram* introduced a three-part idea for sung liturgy, dividing musical elements into three *degrees*. The first degree includes acclamations like the *Sanctus* and *Amen*, the second adds parts like the *Gloria* and Responsorial Psalm, and the third encompasses the full Proper and Ordinary of the Mass. This structure allows communities to build toward fuller celebrations as resources and occasions permit.

The principle is further noted in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM), which emphasizes that the liturgy should reflect the nature of the celebration—whether it be a weekday Mass, a solemnity, or a major feast. The GIRM encourages the use of music, ministers, and ritual elements in proportion to the day's significance. At its heart, this principle is both theological and pastoral. Theologically, it reflects the Church's understanding of time and sanctity: some days in the liturgical calendar are more closely aligned with the mysteries of Christ and so merit greater festivity. Sundays, solemnities, and feasts are privileged moments of encounter with the divine. Pastorally, it acknowledges the diversity of parish life. Not every community has a full choir, a team of servers, or the capacity for elaborate ritual.

Progressive solemnity allows for flexibility without compromising reverence. In practice, this guides decisions about music, ministers, vestments, and gestures. Weekday Masses may be celebrated simply, with spoken parts and minimal music. Feasts and Solemnities invite fuller expression—chant, incense, processions, and expanded ministerial roles. The Easter Vigil exemplifies the fullest solemnity, incorporating all degrees of liturgical richness.

Kim Mandelkow, a onetime director for the Office of Divine Worship in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, compares this principle to planning meals at home: a peanut butter sandwich differs from Thanksgiving dinner, and so too does a Tuesday Mass differ from Pentecost Sunday. Some of her fellow liturgists argue that it can lead to inconsistency or minimalism, or even a "checklist" that reduces solemnity to a matter of just adding things at will. Others note that the principle can take away solemnity from major feasts due to lack of resources...or just bad planning. Done properly, progressive solemnity does not become an excuse for minimalism, but a tool for real pastoral excellence.

Progressive solemnity offers a lens into the Church's liturgical wisdom. It teaches that worship is not static but responsive—attuned to time, community, and the mysteries being celebrated. It invites assemblies, ministers and musicians to discern how best to honor the sacred within their means. It is not about doing less or more, but about doing what is fitting. It is a principle of ars celebrandi—the art of celebration—that calls our Church to reverence, creativity, and fidelity.


