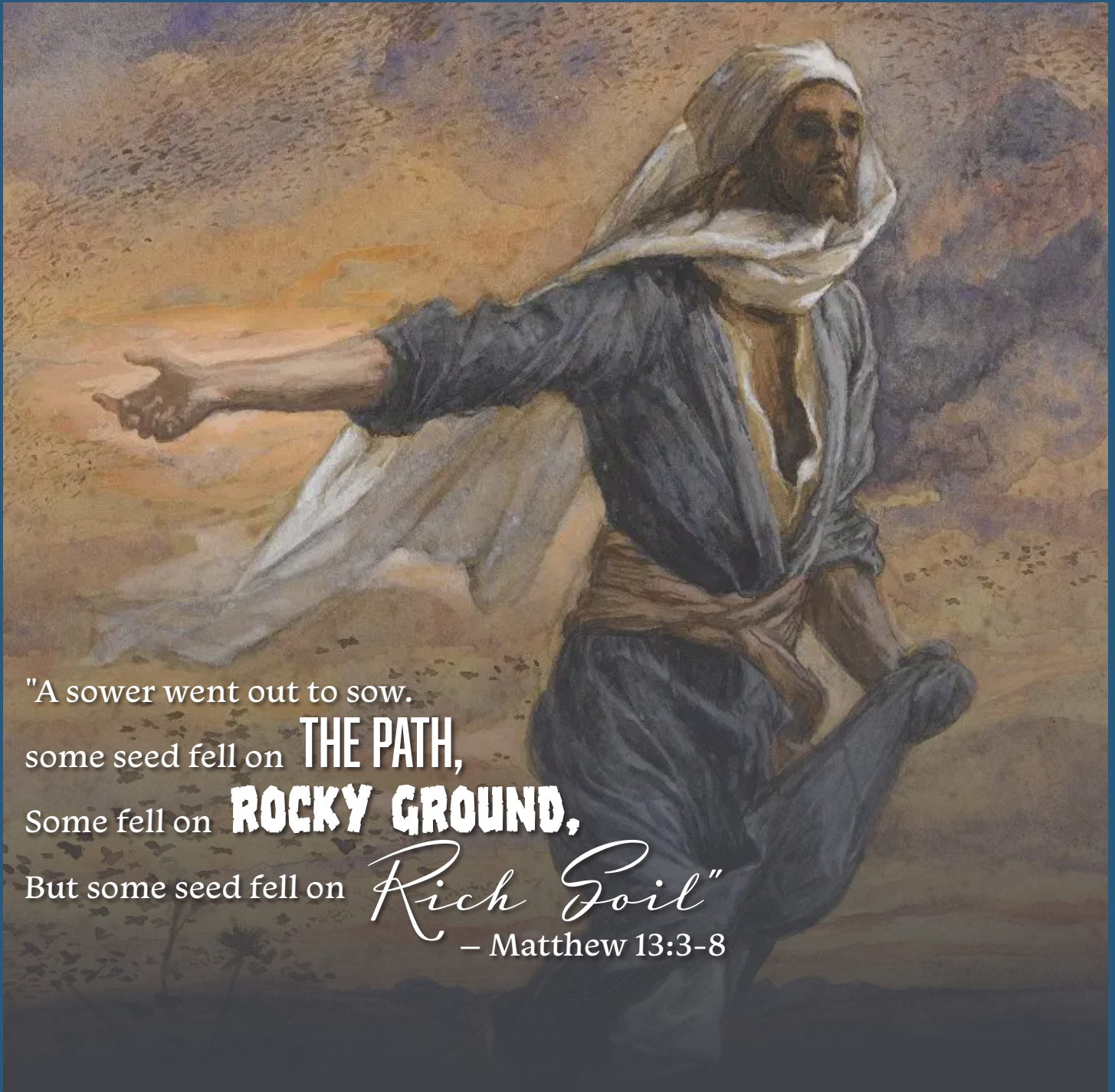

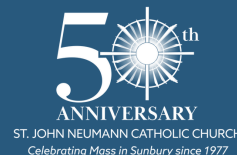

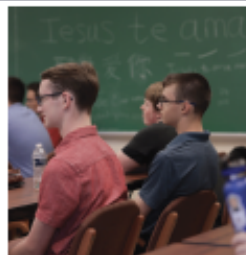

When Diversity Becomes Division: Unity in the Larger Church

Many watched the May 2022 ordination of Earl Fernandes as a bishop, followed immediately by his being installed as our Bishop of Columbus. There is a lot that happens when a priest is ordained – also known as consecrated – to the episcopacy, but one thing worth noting is that it's done not by a single shepherd but three, including the *Papal Nuncio*, the Vatican's ambassador to the U.S.A. The three co-consecrating bishops, including the representative from the Vatican, are a visible sign of unity with the Bishop of Rome and his brother bishops in the United States and around the world. It really is an important, outward sign for the Church.

The situation with the attempted episcopal consecrations this month of four priests of the Society of Saint Pius X (SSPX) represents one of the most serious ruptures between a group of Catholics and Rome since 1988. The Vatican has repeatedly warned that any bishop consecrated without permission (a *papal mandate*), and any bishop who performs such a consecration, incurs automatic *excommunication* under Canon Law, a precedent established by Pope St. John Paul II in his letter *Ecclesia Dei* (1988). The consequences were expected and obvious – the society, its priests and religious and those laypeople adhering to them are now separated from the Catholic Church, in a state of schism (a Greek word literally meaning "tearing apart"). Schism, like apostasy (leaving the Christian faith) and heresy (choosing and/or teaching false doctrine), is mortally sinful and a delict (a crime) against the unity of the entire Church.

The SSPX was founded in 1970 by then-Archbishop Marcel Lefebvre, a former Superior General of the missionary Holy Ghost Fathers and a prominent voice among conservatives and fundamentalists during the Second Vatican Council (1962-65). The society began with provisional Vatican approval. Lefebvre's theological concerns gradually focused on Council statements on religious freedom (*Dignitatis Humanae*, 1965), relationships with non-Catholic Christians including the Jewish people (*Nostra Aetate*, 1965) and the topic of collegiality among leaders, those in ministry, and the whole people of God (*Lumen Gentium*, 1964). Despite the Council having a pastoral focus and not a dogmatic one, he believed these represented breaks with prior teaching. Lefebvre had actually signed off on all the Conciliar documents, but quickly became a rallying point for Catholics uneasy with modernization in general and these postconciliar reforms in particular. By 1975, the Vatican suppressed (closed) the SSPX, citing concerns over its growing resistance to the Council. Lefebvre refused to dissolve the society, and as a result in 1976 Pope St. Paul VI suspended him, forbidding him from exercising any priestly ministry.

The major break occurred on July 1, 1988, when Lefebvre – citing fears that Rome would not guarantee the continuation of traditional priestly formation – illicitly consecrated four bishops. Because any consecration requires a papal mandate, Pope St. John Paul II declared soon afterward that Lefebvre and the four bishops had incurred automatic *excommunication* (*latae sententiae*) for committing an act of schism. This was described in *Ecclesia Dei*, which remains the foundational document for understanding the consequences of illicit episcopal consecrations. Lefebvre died in 1991, still under excommunication.

The decades following this rupture saw alternating periods of estrangement and cautious dialogue between the society and the leadership of the Church:

- 2000: SSPX members made a Jubilee pilgrimage to Rome, signaling openness to renewed contact.
- July 7, 2007: Pope Benedict XVI issued *Summorum Pontificum*, expanding access to the Traditional Latin Mass—widely seen as a gesture toward the SSPX and other traditionalist groups.
- 2009: Benedict XVI lifted the excommunications of the four surviving SSPX bishops, though the society remained known as "canonically irregular."
- 2015: Pope Francis granted SSPX priests the faculties (permission) to hear confessions validly. Two years later, Francis extended faculties to include witnessing marriages.

These gestures acknowledged the spiritual needs of the faithful who attend SSPX chapels (the SSPX do not have parishes or territory), stopping short of granting canonical recognition. However, the promulgation of *Traditionis Custodes* (2021), which defined limits on when and where the Traditional Latin Mass could be celebrated, signaled a tightening of liturgical discipline and indirectly complicated relations. By this year, the SSPX faced a practical problem: only two bishops remained, both very elderly. As a result, on February 2 of this year the society announced its intention to consecrate new bishops on July 1—again, without the needed mandate. Pope Leo XIV (elected in 2025) was expected to follow the 1988 precedent by declaring the excommunications now in force. The Church's position is clear: *Illicit episcopal consecration merits excommunication* for both consecrator and consecrated. This is rooted in current canon law and reaffirmed in 1988's *Ecclesia Dei*.

The SSPX countered that they recognize the Pope and pray for him in their Canon of the Mass. Their actions aim at "the salvation of souls," the Church's highest law, listed at the end of the 1983 *Code of Canon Law* text itself. Some canonists questioned whether excommunication is valid without the intent to reject Papal authority. But the Vatican maintains that consecrating bishops without any papal mandate is *by itself* schismatic, regardless of any stated loyalty. The SSPX chose July 1 deliberately: the anniversary of the 1988 excommunications. The symbolism underscores their belief that they must secure episcopal succession to preserve traditional priestly formation. The Vatican saw the date and the act as direct provocations.

This is the most severe canonical rupture in modern (post-Reformation) church history. There are other existing groups who call themselves "Catholic" but separated from Rome (the Polish National Church, the so-called Palmarians in Spain, the dozens of small "Old Catholic" churches, to name a few), but this would be the largest and most publicly known split. Excommunicated groups such as these may look Catholic, worship with outwardly Catholic elements and use reasoning with similar theological and philosophical language, but are in fact outside the communion of the Church, and in essence Protestant.

For ordinary Catholics, especially those drawn to traditional Latin-language liturgy, this situation can be painful. However, there are several groups well in communion with Rome that celebrate the Traditional Latin Mass and actively perform ministry to the Church (for example, the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter, the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest, among others). Participation in SSPX activities now incurs penalties, as affiliation with a formally schismatic group would raise serious concerns. The Church's repeated warnings aim to prevent faithful Catholics from being drawn into a rupture that harms Church unity. The underlying conflict is not merely about the style or language of liturgy; it is about authority, the understanding of the nature and function of the Church, and the interpretation of Vatican II, which has the teaching authority of the 20 other councils that happened before it through history.

For all of us, the Church's message remains consistent: pray for unity, avoid schism, and trust that fidelity to the Bishop of Rome (as the successor of Peter and Vicar of Christ) is the surest path to communion with the whole Catholic Church.
