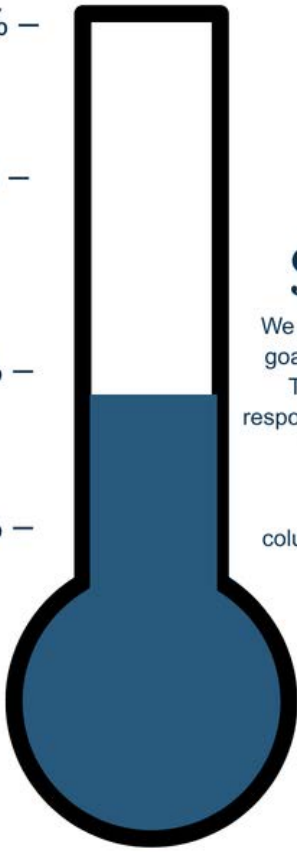

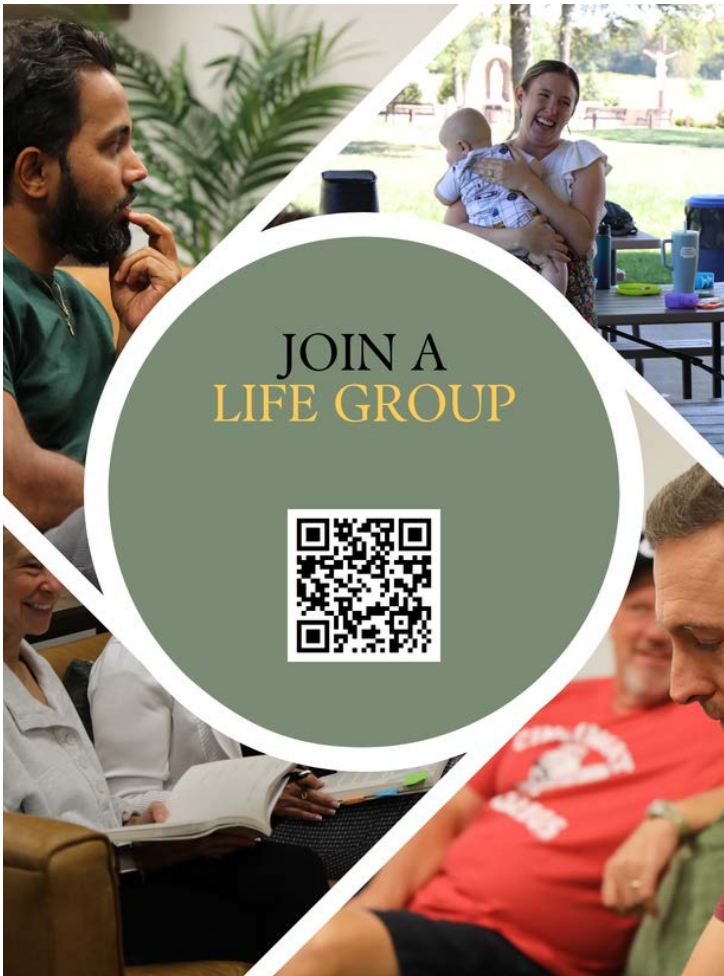

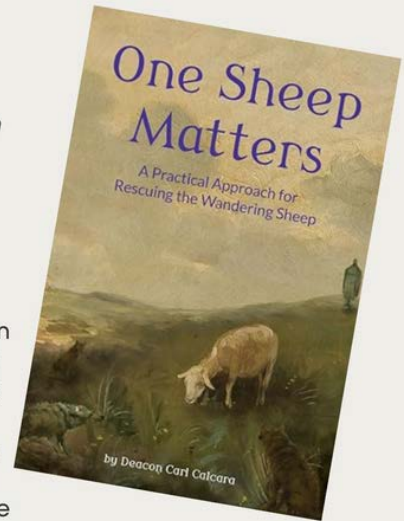

Little Liturgical Lessons

There is Nothing Ordinary about Ordinary Time!

“The green vestments of Ordinary Time symbolize growth—slow, steady, organic growth.”

Pentecost Sunday is called the “Birthday of the Church,” commemorating what’s depicted in the Acts of the Apostles, where those in the Cenacle (the Upper Room) receive the presence of the Holy Spirit, giving them what they need to ecstatically proclaim the story of Jesus: the *kerygma* (“that which is proclaimed”) on that day. At Mass there is much said and done about the Holy Spirit, including a Sequence (hymn of proclamation) that happens before the reading of the Gospel.

In many places the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, in that order) are given to those who have prepared for them. Would that we become as ecstatic to proclaim the Lord Jesus as His first disciples were!

Pentecost is also the final day of the Easter Season, with its fiery start at the *Lucernarium*, the Service of Light that opened the Easter Vigil, 50 short days ago. When midnight falls, we will leave the Paschal Season and transition into what we call *Ordinary Time*. The days we’ll count from then until Advent (not too far away!) won’t focus on a given mystery of the life of Christ, but allow us to celebrate an incredibly diverse Church, featuring the witness of our saints, the history of salvation and the deep roots of what we know now as Catholic tradition.

For many—especially those geared to an academic calendar—Ordinary Time can feel like a spiritual exhale. After the intensity of Lent, the drama of the Triduum, and the radiant joy of Easter, the green vestments and numbered Sundays may seem like a return to “normal.” Ordinary Time is anything *but* ordinary. It’s a season of *becoming*—a long stretch of the year when the Holy Spirit quietly forms disciples into mature witnesses of Christ. These are counted weeks—*ordered weeks*—in which the Church walks steadily through the Gospel, Sunday by Sunday, listening to Jesus doing His work. If Advent and Lent are seasons of *preparation*, and Christmas and Easter are seasons of *celebration*, then Ordinary Time is the season of *transformation*. It’s where the slow work of grace can unfold. It is also deeply *Christological*. The Gospels proclaimed during these weeks invite us to contemplate Jesus’ public ministry. We’ll hear Him preach and reveal the Kingdom of God in parables and encounters. Jesus meets people in the midst of their daily routines: fishermen at their nets, tax collectors at their tables, the sick in their homes, the curious along the road. Ordinary Time reminds us that discipleship is lived not only in the dramatic moments but in steady, faithful offering of ordinary days.

It’s also punctuated by feasts that reveal the richness of Catholic tradition and remind us that the days aren’t spiritually flat. It’s a tapestry of celebrations of doctrine, sacrament, and sanctity. They also remind us that the Church’s story is not confined to the past; it is alive in every generation. Among them:

- *Trinity Sunday* (the first Sunday after Pentecost): a celebration of the central mystery of Christian faith—not an abstract doctrine, but the living communion of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit into which we are baptized.
- *The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)*: a feast that draws our attention to the Eucharist as the “source and summit” of the Christian life, inviting public witness through processions and adoration.
- *The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary* (August 15): a holy day that proclaims Mary’s participation in Christ’s triumph over death, and her own role as the first disciple.
- All Saints’ Day (November 1): a celebration of the countless men and women—canonized and unknown—who have lived the Gospel in every age and culture.

This season has its own roll call of holiness: Anthony of Padua, Benedict of Nursia, Lawrence the deacon/martyr, Ignatius of Loyola, Augustine, Teresa of Calcutta, Thérèse of Lisieux, and countless others. Their lives are diverse—scholars, missionaries, mystics, martyrs, parents, workers—but share a common thread: they allowed God to sanctify the ordinary circumstances of their lives. The saints offer a reminder that holiness is not a rarity, but a daily invitation. Ordinary Time is when we can learn to say “yes” to God in small things, trusting that He will make something extraordinary of them.

The green vestments of Ordinary Time symbolize growth—slow, steady, organic growth. This is a spirituality of the season: not dramatic conversion moments, but patient cultivation of virtue. For us, it can be the season of consistency in prayer, perseverance in charity, attentiveness to the Word of God and Integration of faith into daily life. In a culture that prizes instant results, Ordinary Time teaches the value of endurance. It invites us to let the Gospel sink into the soil of our lives, and allow the Holy Spirit to shape our habits, relationships, and decisions.

Finally, Ordinary Time is a season of *mission*. The green season is the time when the Church, empowered by Pentecost, goes out into the world. The Gospel readings often end with Jesus sending His disciples to preach, heal, and serve. The same commission is given to us. For those making travel plans during these warmer months, this is especially poignant. You can step into communities, workplaces, and relationships where the Gospel is needed—not always through words, but through integrity, compassion, courage, and hope. Ordinary Time is the Church’s reminder that every baptized person is sent.

As our Paschal Candle is returned to its place by the Baptismal Font and the green vestments reappear, the Church invites us into the longest and most spiritually demanding season of the year. Ordinary Time can be where discipleship becomes real, where the lessons of Easter can take root. It is where the Holy Spirit received at Pentecost continues to work quietly—but with *power*.
