

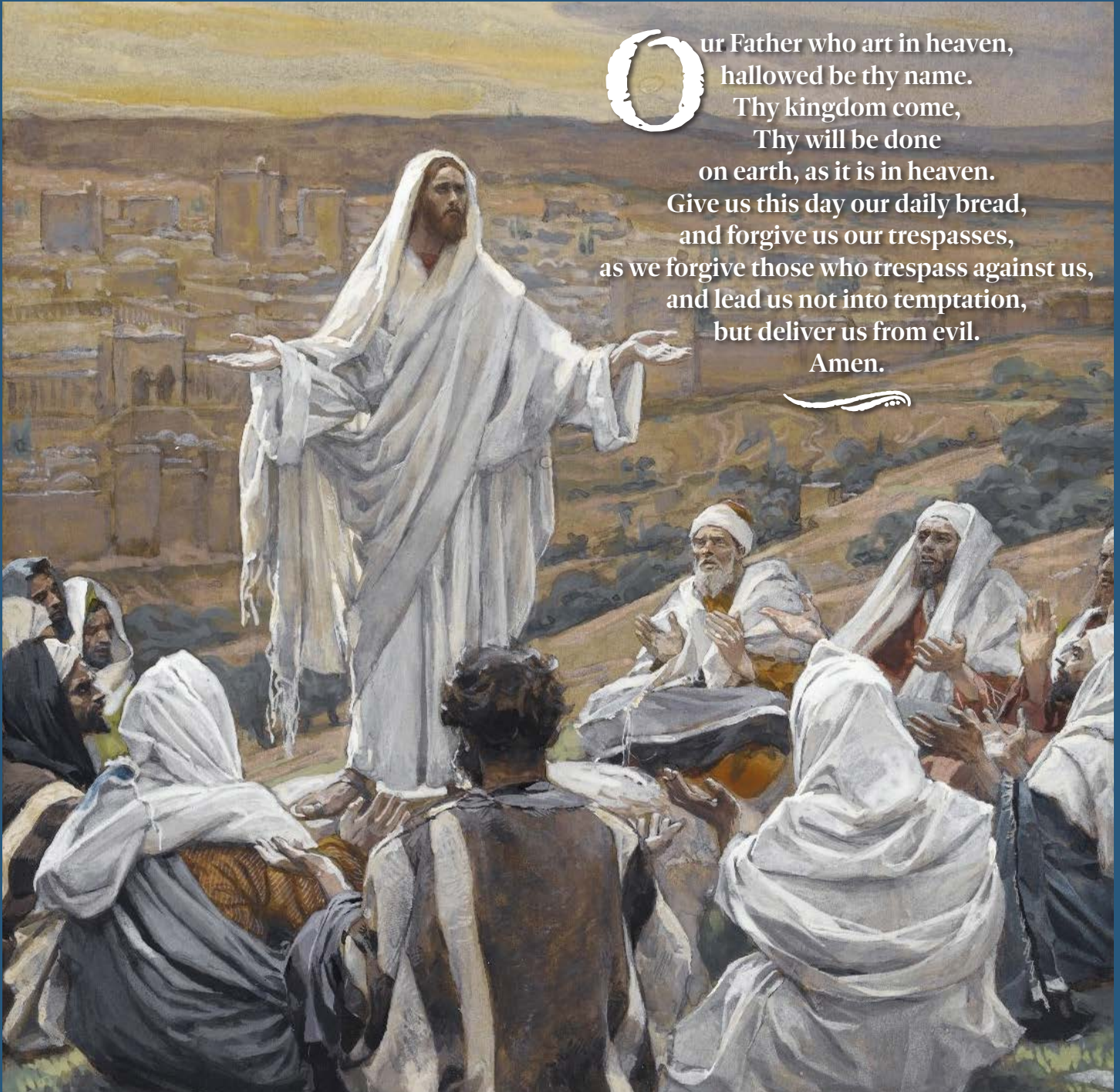

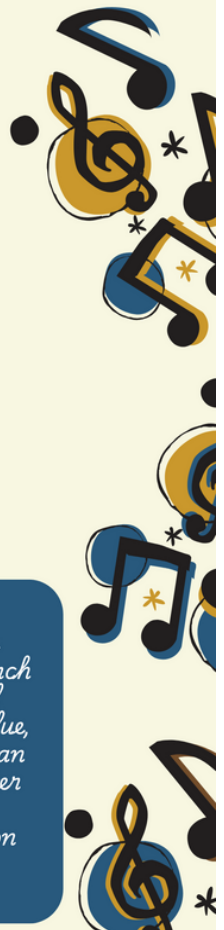

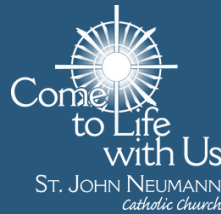

A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Mass Schedule Updates Based on Parish Survey

Dear brothers and sisters,

Earlier this summer, St. John Neumann Church conducted a parish-wide survey on the needs and desires of parishioners regarding our Weekday and Weekend Masses. The survey focused particularly on Mass times and the reasons parishioners choose to attend at specific times.

Our Parish Leadership Team—which includes myself and members of our parish staff—reviewed survey results, considered Mass times at neighboring parishes, and discussed options that would:

- Accommodate our growing Catholic community both within and beyond our parish boundaries
- Support evangelization and discipleship opportunities at reasonable times on Sundays
- Allow for safer and more efficient traffic flow before and after Mass
- Ensure the safe and effective use of our facilities and worship spaces throughout the week

Survey results showed strong support for our current Mass schedule, along with interest in a few additions. In response to your input and with the support of our growing clergy team, I'm pleased to share the following updates:

- The Monday 11:00 am Mass has resumed as of Monday, July 7.
- The Sunday 5:00 pm Mass will resume as of Sunday, September 7.
- With the arrival of our new Parochial Vicar, Fr. Elias Udeh, we are also exploring the possibility of adding an additional Sunday morning Mass in the future.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the survey and share thoughtful comments. Your input has been invaluable and offers much to reflect on as we continue to grow in our mission of worship, discipleship, and service at St. John Neumann.

Let us continue to pray for one another as we seek to be faithful stewards of God's grace in our parish community.

HOW IMPORTANT IS MUSIC AT MASS?

Music has profound significance in Catholic liturgy. It isn't entertainment or enhancement, but is a vital expression of prayer, unity, and sacred tradition. From the earliest centuries of the Church, music lifted hearts and minds toward God. The Catechism of the Catholic Church affirms "musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art" (CCC 1156). Sacred music is not just an accompaniment to worship — it's an integral part of liturgical action. When the faithful sing, they participate more fully in the mystery of the Mass, engaging both body and spirit.

Echoes of Heaven: Gregorian Chant in the Mass

Historically, Gregorian chant has been the cornerstone of Catholic liturgical music. Its unadorned, meditative melodies are designed to reflect solemnity and transcendence of the sacred rites. The Second Vatican Council document *Sacrosanctum Concilium* emphasized that chant "should be given pride of place in liturgical services" (SC 116). This form, deeply rooted in tradition, fosters a contemplative atmosphere that draws us into deeper communion with God.

Sacred Music Beyond Chant: Beauty, Unity, and Truth

The Church recognizes the value of other musical forms, of course, provided they are in harmony with the sacred nature of the liturgy. The 1967 instruction *Musica Sacram* states that sacred music must be "created for the celebration of divine worship" and possess "a certain holy sincerity of form" (MS 4). This includes polyphony, organ music, and even certain adapted forms, as long as they maintain reverence and theological soundness.

Music enriches the liturgy by enhancing its beauty, uniting the congregation, and expressing the truths of the faith. Hymns and psalms often draw from Scripture, reinforcing God's Word, while the Responsorial Psalm invites reflection through melody. Music also teaches: By repeatedly singing parts of the Mass — like the Kyrie, Gloria, and Sanctus — we internalize prayers and doctrine, building a shared repertoire of sacred music throughout the liturgical year.

When We Sing, We Pray Together

The Church calls for active participation in the liturgy, and sacred music is a key way the faithful engage. Through hymns, acclamations, and chants, we become co-celebrants in the sacred mysteries. As sacred art, music unites us, deepens prayer, and glorifies God. Rooted in tradition and open to cultural expression, it can powerfully transform the experience of Mass, especially on Sundays and feast days.
