Sharing Christ's Mercy Through the Universal Church

The Bishop Iruthayaraj Foundation, established in Columbus, Ohio, in 2024, honors the Christ-centered legacy of Bishop Savarinathen Iruthayaraj and serves vulnerable communities through education, healthcare, pastoral care, and missionary support. With the support of leaders including Bishop Earl K. Fernandes and Archbishop Antonysamy Savarimuthu, the foundation helps strengthen communities in need as part of the Church's shared missionary mission.

This work is both practical and spiritual. Through supported efforts, 5,000+ children receive education annually, 200+ youth have received vocational support, and 50+ parish communities have been strengthened. The mission also helps provide rural clinics, clean water projects, support for seminarians and altar servers, and sacred spaces for worship and formation.

In Zambia, a borehole project brought clean water to a community where there had been no water for 20 miles, and schoolchildren were seen drinking clean water for the first time. In Ayalpatti, India, the mission has helped support parish improvements including chapel and altar work, presbytery and sacred space development, and the Blessed Mother's grotto.

Jesus teaches us in Matthew 25:40 that what we do for the least, we do for Him. Your parish's support is a real participation in the Universal Church's mission of mercy. Help is needed now, because many communities still face hardship, under-resourced facilities, and ongoing vulnerability. Through prayer and generosity, we can stand with them in Christ.

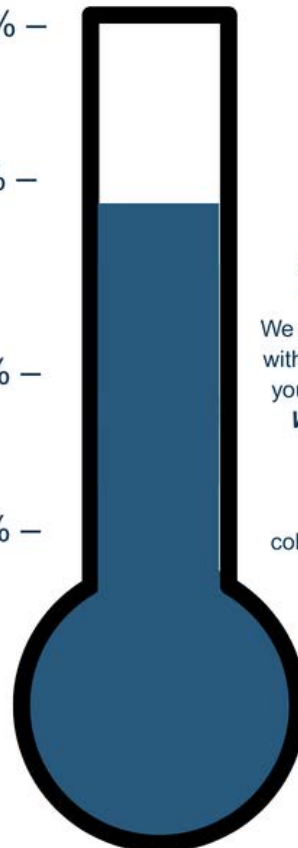

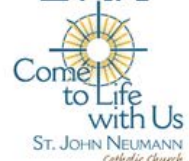

RENEWING THE GRACE OF THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Many couples married civilly—but not in the Catholic Church—have recently begun the process of Convalidation, where they exchange vows before a priest or deacon and two witnesses. Through this simple yet profound step, they become sacramentally married in the Church.

Making the Sacraments a Habit, not an Obligation

“The Church’s sacramental life is itself a system—a divinely instituted pattern of embodied practices—that slowly, imperceptibly, forms a believer into a disciple.”

We as Catholics don’t just drift into a life shaped by the Eucharist and the Sacraments. We *grow* into it through intentional, repeated, embodied practices that slowly, gradually redirect our desires. The difference between “fulfilling an obligation” and “living a sacramental life” isn’t just about motivation or emotion; it’s about *formation*. One of my favorite books is from James K. A. Smith, *You Are What You Love* (Brazos, 2016), who writes that human beings aren’t really “thinking things” at all, but “desiring creatures,” shaped by *liturgies*—both sacred and secular—that we choose to inhabit. If our habits are formed by the mall (a “secular cathedral”), the smartphone, social media or the calendar, then our loves will be shaped accordingly. If our habits are formed by the Mass, the Sacraments, and the rhythms of the Church’s year, then our loves will be drawn toward God. I heartily commend this book to your summer reading list!

Insights of *habit theory*, especially from another good book, James Clear’s *Atomic Habits* (Avery, 2018), are surprisingly like Catholic spirituality. Clear insists that “you do not rise to the level of your goals; you fall to the level of your systems.” Catholic tradition has always known this. The Church’s sacramental life is itself a system—a divinely instituted pattern of embodied practices—that slowly, imperceptibly, forms a believer into a disciple. The question, then, is how we can intentionally develop the habit of attending Mass and celebrating the Sacraments not as mere duties but as the natural expression of a life reordered toward God.

Clear’s first insight is that habits grow from *identity*. We don’t simply *do* things; we do them because of who we understand ourselves to be. He writes “the most effective way to change your habits is to focus not on what you want to achieve, but on who you wish to become.” For us, this identity is already given in Baptism: we are members of Christ’s Body, participants in His *priestly, prophetic, and kingly* mission. The shift from obligation to intentionality begins with reclaiming our identity. A Catholic who sees Mass as a weekly requirement will approach it with near-minimal engagement. A Catholic who sees himself as a worshiper—one whose life is ordered toward the praise of God—will gravitate toward the Eucharistic celebration.

Smith’s anthropology reinforces this: our deepest identity is shaped by what we love, and what we love is shaped by the practices we inhabit. To see oneself as a *Eucharistic person* is to be already drawn toward the altar. A practical step here is to articulate this identity explicitly. Clear recommends small, identity-based statements: “I am the kind of person who...” For Catholics, this might become: “I am the kind of person who begins each week at the altar,” or “I am the kind of person who seeks Christ in the Sacraments.” These statements are not self-help slogans; they are reminders of baptismal truth.

Clear’s “four laws” of behavior change map surprisingly well onto the Church’s pastoral wisdom:

Make it obvious: Put reminders of the sacramental life in your physical environment. A Missal on the nightstand, a Crucifix near the door, a parish schedule (or this Bulletin!) on the refrigerator—not as superstitious tokens but environmental cues.

Smith emphasizes that secular liturgies shape us through the spaces we inhabit; the same is true of sacred cues that point us toward even momentary worship.

Make it attractive: This doesn’t mean Mass as entertainment. Rather, it means connecting the practice to our deepest desires. Clear notes that habits become attractive when they are associated with belonging. We can cultivate this by forming relationships within the parish: joining a ministry, attending a Life Group, or simply arriving early enough to see and greet others. Experiencing real human communion reinforces the desire for Sacramental Communion.

Make it easy: Clear insists that reducing friction is essential. This might mean choosing a consistent Mass time, preparing clothes the night before, or arranging transportation or childcare with others. The goal is not to trivialize worship but to remove those unnecessary obstacles that can make attendance feel burdensome.

Make it satisfying: The Church provides the deepest form of satisfaction: the grace of the Sacraments. Clear’s insight is that immediate, tangible reinforcement helps habits stick. Catholics might reflect briefly after Mass on one moment of grace, one line of Scripture, or one interior movement. This creates a positive feedback loop.

Smith argues that “liturgies”—those repeated, embodied practices—shape our loves more powerfully than ideas. To develop the habit of sacramental life, Catholics must embrace the physicality of worship. This includes **arriving early** to settle the body and mind, **participating fully** in gestures, responses, and singing, practicing silence before and after Mass to allow the heart to absorb grace. **Preparing intentionally** through prayer, Scripture, or daily examination of conscience also empowers these habits and redirects us when we stray. These practices can be the means by which the Holy Spirit forms desire. Over time, the body learns the rhythms of worship, and the heart follows.

Finally, both Clear and Smith acknowledge—implicitly or explicitly—that transformation is gradual. Clear writes that “habits are the compound interest of self-improvement.” Smith would say that liturgies slowly recalibrate desire. The Church would say, of course, that grace builds on nature. We who intentionally cultivate the habit of Mass and Sacraments will not always feel fervent. But over time, the repeated encounter with Christ in the Eucharist, Reconciliation, and the rhythms of the liturgical year will reshape our heart. What begins as intentional Catholic practice can, with God’s help, become spiritual instinct.
