





EMBRACING LENTEN MUSIC



As we continue the Lenten season at St. John Neumann—a season of penance, prayer, and preparation for Easter—our liturgical music intentionally shifts to reflect the Church's long-held traditions. These changes help us enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ's Passion and Resurrection.

One major change is moving from our familiar sung English Mass settings to chanted Latin versions of the Kyrie, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei. This connects us to the universal heritage of the Church, as Latin and Gregorian chant foster a sense of solemnity and timelessness, uniting us with generations of believers.

Our music also becomes more subdued and contemplative. The lively instrumental sounds of Ordinary Time give way to simpler melodies, minimal accompaniment, and sometimes a cappella singing. This musical fasting mirrors Lent's call to simplicity, repentance, and interior conversion. Hymns and psalms take on a more penitential tone, preparing our hearts for the Paschal Triduum.

These musical changes are a gift, drawing us closer to Christ. May we welcome them with open hearts this Lent.




How to Lent

Little Liturgical Lessons

When Silence Should Set the Tone

For many Catholics, the moments immediately following Mass are among the most grace-filled of the whole week. The Church has always encouraged a spirit of quiet recollection after the celebration of the liturgy, not as a rule imposed from above but as a natural extension of what just happened. Much like during Mass itself, silence *after* Mass is not an absence of activity; it is the space where the mystery of the Eucharist continues to do great work within us.

During the celebration of the Mass, we are drawn once more into the *Paschal Mystery* – Christ’s self-offering to the Father for the salvation of the world. It is, after all, the theme of *every single Mass*. In Holy Communion, this becomes intensely personal. We receive the Body and Blood of Christ, and the Church invites us to savor this gift. Silence allows the heart to rest in the presence of the One it has received. It is a moment of intimate thanksgiving, when words fall short and the soul simply abides in Christ.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) notes that “sacred silence... should be observed at the designated times” during the liturgy, and this principle naturally extends *beyond the dismissal*. Silence after Mass is a continuation of worship, a way of letting the grace of the sacrament settle in us deeply, rather than evaporate in the noise of mundane conversation, or the rush to the parking lot, or the line for donuts or the nearby Cracker Barrel.

For centuries, Catholics have lingered after Mass to pray. This practice grew especially strong in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, when devotional life flourished in parishes across Europe and North America. The rise of *popular devotions*—such as the Rosary, the Stations of the Cross, the Sacred Heart devotion, and various litanies from centuries past—reflected a deep hunger for personal, affective prayer. Many Catholics remained in church after Mass to make a “thanksgiving,” a period of quiet prayer expressing gratitude for Holy Communion. Many wanted to pray with the knowledge that certain prayers were an “indulged work,” eligible for graces when combined with Confession, Communion and a prayer for the intentions of the Bishop of Rome. (An often-misunderstood topic, we’ve covered the practice of *Indulgences* in this space earlier).

By the time of the Second Vatican Council (1962-65), devotions were woven into the deep fabric of parish life. While the Council encouraged a renewed focus on the liturgy itself as the “source and summit” of Christian life, it never discouraged personal prayer. Instead, it clarified a distinction between the Church’s *public* worship (the word *liturgy* means “public work”) and private devotions, encouraging each to flourish - in its proper place. Silence after Mass became an even more important bridge between the two: a moment when the communal celebration gives way to *personal encounter*. (For a more profound reflection on the value of silence, I recommend Max Picard’s stunning 1952 book *The World of Silence*.)

Remaining quiet after Mass is also an act of charity. Not everyone prays in the same way or at the same pace. Some need a few minutes to kneel and speak to the Lord; others simply sit in stillness. A *reverent hush* in the church honors the needs of those around us. It communicates that we recognize the sacredness of what has just occurred and that we respect the spiritual lives of our brothers and sisters. In a culture saturated with noise, silence becomes a countercultural witness. It reminds us that God often speaks in the “still, small voice” Elijah heard on the mountain. When a parish cultivates this atmosphere, it forms disciples who know how to listen—not only to God, but to one another.

Here at St. John Neumann, we have chosen to respect decisions made by our local Bishop – the chief servant and guide for liturgy in our local Church – about devotions following Mass. Bishop Fernandes has stated that there is to be no devotional prayer said aloud either within Mass itself, or immediately after. This includes the St. Michael Prayer or the *Divine Praises*. This directive has been implemented so as to allow these and other prayers to be said silently and with thanksgiving by those choosing to do so following the Recessional Hymn. (The practice of communal recitation of the *Divine Praises* following our daily Masses will end, effective immediately.)

The dismissal at Mass sends us forth to live what we have celebrated. Far from being a passive moment, silence is the Church’s gentle way of helping us transition from worship into witness. In the end, silence after Mass is a simple practice with a profound effect. It honors the Eucharist, deepens personal prayer, supports the devotion of others, and strengthens our readiness to live as missionary disciples.

In a world that rarely slows down, a few quiet minutes may be among the most important of the week. Give it a try!
