Family of Faith, for families with children in grades 1-4, brings St. John Neumann families together on the first Tuesday of the month at 6 pm, October-April, to worship together at Mass, learn about the life of Jesus Christ, His teachings, and our Catholic Faith. We invite you to attend! At home, parents will help their children fall in love with Jesus as they journey toward Heaven as a family.

Our regularly scheduled Tuesday daily Mass at 6 pm is a great way to start off our time together with worship for both parent(s) and children! Daily Mass is shorter (usually 25-30 minutes) and the simplicity allows children to better grasp the structure of our worship.

Dury and other Catholic leaders have learned from experience that simply being dropped off for PSR does not have a great enough impact on the development of a child's faith.

Our goal is to help families grow in faith together, with parents and children involved in fun activities and conversations that are laying a strong foundation for faith. We want to support you in your work of educating your loved ones in the Catholic faith, and we want to provide you with the tools you need in your everyday life so that faith becomes woven into the fabric of your family.

Middle School, Grades 5 & 6

01 OUR PROGRAM

We are excited to welcome you to our Middle School Program! This program is for 5th & 6th graders and is designed to be a building block for Confirmation preparation, which will begin in 7th grade.

02 OUR GOALS

Our program is designed to meet the educational, spiritual, emotional and social needs of young adolescents. We work cooperatively with families as you continue to build upon your child's faith formation and navigate this new stage of spiritual development. We strive to foster a transforming spiritual experience of Jesus through the liturgy, allowing early adolescents to experience the Word of God and the Eucharist in a deeper and more profound way. We want to create a positive experience of the Catholic Church for early adolescents, assisting middle school youth in gaining a deeper understanding and appreciation of what the Catholic Church teaches and believes.

03 WHEN WE MEET

Our Middle School program will meet twice a month on the 2nd and 4th Sundays, from 3:30 pm-4:45 pm, snacks included. In addition to our Sunday meetings, we encourage our middle school students and families to join in our Community Nights on the first Tuesday of each month. Community Nights are a time to worship together at Mass, grow in discipleship, and learn about our Catholic faith. Fr. Dury will lead these teachings for the middle schoolers, follwed by small group time to process and discuss what is presented.



Sacramental Preparation

FIRST RECONCILIATION & FIRST COMMUNION

Beginning in the fall of 2023, preparation for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion will be a 2-year process.

First Year: First grade students begin preparing for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion.

Seek - meets late August-December, 2nd Tuesday of the month, 6:00-7:15 pm, pizza provided; children participate in activities while parents meet in small groups

Root - meets January-April, 2nd Tuesday of the month, 6:00-7:15 pm, pizza provided; children participate in activities while parents meet in small groups; includes an at-home component

Second Year: Second grade students continue their preparation.

Mend - preparation for First Reconciliation; an at-home program with content for August-December; also includes 4 Sunday support sessions which meet from 10:05-10:55 am, September-November

Nourish - preparation for First Communion; an at-home program with content for January-April; also includes 6 Sunday support sessions which meet from 10:05-10:55 am, January-April

CONFIRMATION

Beginning in the fall of 2023, preparation for Confirmation will be a 2-year process, with 7th grade students starting their formation and 8th grade students preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. All students will meet on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month from 3:30-4:45 pm, as we study the Confirmation program, CHOSEN. In addition to the video series, Pathway boxes will be available to families for the at-home component of our program. The boxes will encourage participation from the entire family as their teen journeys in faith towards receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. The content focuses on the lives of the saints and on the Corporal and Spiritual works of mercy.

The 2023/2024 school year is a transition year. Those children entering 2nd and 8th grade for the 2023 school year will maintain a one-year program.









High School Youth Ministry meets Sunday evenings, September 10, 2023 -April 28, 2024 from 6-8 pm, following the 5 pm Mass.

High School Youth Ministry at St. John Neumann is very well-rounded! Sunday evenings will be led by Sam Struppa, our Youth Ministry and Confirmation Coordinator, and two Damascus Missionaries from the Jesus Movement Affiliate Program. Each night will include dinner, social time/games, a faith-based message, and small group time to process the evening.

Once a month, we will incorporate a large group event for our teens. In addition to the Sunday evening youth group, high school students are encouraged to attend our Community Nights on the first Tuesday of each month at 6 pm.
