



All requests must be submitted by December 2, 2025.


Becoming a Christmas Angel

Little Liturgical Lessons

The Great American Catholic Workout: Sit, Stand, Kneel, Repeat

People talk about all the postures and gestures we use in the liturgy. We worship with our hearts and minds, of course, but also with our bodies. Our Jewish forebears did as much, as seen throughout the Old Testament. Most of us encounter these at Mass, but we might think very little of it. It happens at other Sacramental celebrations as well...think of what unique things you see during Confession, or what's done during a wedding or an ordination. These have a "body language" with its own sources, meanings and importance, and with time and practice we assemble our own "dictionary" of ritual gestures, with their meanings and use. What does the larger Church do to govern them? Which ones are "mandatory" and which ones are merely "devotional practices" of members of the Assembly? It's more surprising than you think!

Our heritage of worship lasting over 2,000 years is brought into sharp focus by two recent things: the Second Vatican Council (1962-65) and its simplification of worship after nearly four centuries - along with its call for "active participation" - and the *Roman Missal, Third Edition (2010)*, which is that big red book you see on the Altar at Mass. The "public work" of clergy and laypeople alike brings us in unity with our brothers and sisters all over the world. Still, *unity* is never meant to imply *uniformity*, and there are plenty of options used in some places, but not everywhere.

One example: the Catholic bishops in the U.S.A. asked Rome for permission for the faithful to kneel during the entire Eucharistic Prayer, from the Sanctus ("Holy, Holy") to the Final Doxology ("Through Him", etc.) as opposed to what's done elsewhere in the world, where the faithful usually stand or sit. The General Instruction to the *Roman Missal* (the text in the front of that big red book) states that kneeling is done this way "in the dioceses of the United States" (43). A look at a Mass in Canada shows the difference – our northern neighbors kneel at the Sanctus and stay kneeling through the Words of Consecration ("This is my Body," etc.), but after the Memorial Acclamation (We proclaim...," etc.) they *stand* and remain that way until everyone has received Communion. In fact, some American dioceses choose this option, and it's all in accordance with Rome. Sharp-eyed visitors to churches throughout Europe and Latin America will notice differences such as these.

Another in the last few decades, is an innovation (not in the Missal) that has happened in some parishes – the crossing of the arms of those in a Communion line who cannot receive the Eucharist for some reason, expecting a blessing at the end of the line. Why ask for a blessing from a Communion Minister (who, if a lay person, isn't permitted to give public blessings) when everyone will get a perfectly legitimate blessing at the Dismissal by the celebrant priest, at the very end of Mass? The origin is surprising: a well-meaning priest or liturgist wanted to prevent non-communicants from being awkwardly "passed over" by others in pews. To make things more awkward, though, the seemingly "penitential" gesture of crossed arms is in fact the normal gesture in the Eastern Rites of the Church, as well as those who are Orthodox! Sometimes what appears to be a simple solution to an issue yields a more complex issue. Of course, there's an easier fix – if you can't (yet) receive Jesus in Communion, simply walk to the end of your pew, let people pass into the Communion line and then return to your seat.

If you do find yourself at a Catholic Mass where postures and gestures differ from "back at home," it's best to follow one of the governing "principles of liturgy" - used as a guide for "keeping the main thing the main thing" in Catholic worship - namely, the principle of *unity in the assembly*, otherwise known as "When in Rome, do as the Romans do."

The Mass is not an occasion for individual expressions or flourishes, but for collective participation. While well-intentioned, personal gestures can risk a break in the unity and focus of the liturgy. By learning the norms of our particular (that is, *parish*) Church, we demonstrate an openness to the humility and discipline needed to allow the liturgy to serve its purpose – our glorification of God, service to others, and strengthening our unity as the Body of Christ. Amen!


