
### **Annual Expense Summary**

In this season of Thanksgiving, the members of the SJN conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) wish to share our gratitude with the parish for your support of our service to the poor. "No work of charity is foreign to the Society," but we depend on others to help us fulfill our mission.

Donations (parish envelopes, grants, Walk for the Poor sponsorship) increased again this past fiscal year. This allowed us to continue serving local individuals in need as the cost of rent, utilities, and food all increased. Your donations provided food and helped keep neighbors in their homes with working utilities. Your prayers allow us to "serve in hope."

The pie chart illustrates how our conference used our financial blessings from 10/1/24 through 9/30/25. 86% of our funds (\$138,633) were directed to Assistance Intake (AI): rent/mortgage, utilities, and other bill paying AND "twinning" (sharing funds with other SVDP conferences when the need was more than one conference could handle). 14% of our funds supported our conference's other ministries: "Senior groceries" (food given once monthly to residents of two low-income housing complexes in Sunbury); "Prison Ministries" (Bible studies and navigating life after release); Big Walnut Friends Who Share; Family Promise; and others.

We thank God for your role in making sure we can serve & support the needy in our community. Vincentians bear witness to the love of Christ in many ways, including their relationships with those in need. All are invited to join us in spiritual growth and service. We meet every 4th Monday (except Dec.), 7:00 pm in Room 3 below the Faith and Family Center (FFC). Little Liturgical Lessons

### To Everything There is a Season: The Roman Liturgical Calendar

Are you ready for the "New Year"? Our Church's liturgical calendar is a rhythm of created time (*Chronos*) that unfolds for us the timeless mysteries of Christ in this world and the next (*Kairos*) —from Incarnation to Ascension, from Pentecost to the Parousia. Rooted in Scripture and shaped by centuries of tradition, the Roman Calendar guides communal worship and personal discipleship. As the Constitution on the *Sacred Liturgy* teaches, "In the course of the year, the Church unfolds the whole mystery of Christ" (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*, no. 102).

Advent begins the liturgical year, a season of *hopeful expectation* and preparation for both the Nativity and Christ's Second Coming. Marked by violet (*not* purple!) vestments and the gradual lighting of the Advent Wreath, it invites us to "stay awake" (Matthew 24:42) and prepare our hearts. The *General Norms for the Liturgical Year* emphasize its dual focus: "Advent has a twofold character: as a season to prepare for Christmas... and as a season when that remembrance directs the mind to Christ's second coming" (GNLY, no. 39).

Christmas celebrates the Incarnation—God made flesh in Jesus Christ. The season begins with the Vigil Mass on December 24 and continues through the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (January 12 this coming year). White and gold vestments reflect joy and heavenly glory. "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14) is its central proclamation. The *Roman Missal* offers rich texts that echo the angelic hymn: "Glory to God in the highest" (Luke 2:14).

Ordinary Time follows in two segments: after the Baptism of the Lord, and after Pentecost. "Ordinary" means "counted," not "plain," and is a time of spiritual growth, marked by green vestments. The Church reflects on Christ's public ministry, calling us to discipleship. Sunday readings from the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke, "seen together" by its common sources) guide our journey. As the Lectionary for Mass notes, "The Sundays in Ordinary Time... present the mystery of Christ in all its aspects over the course of the year."

Lent is a penitential season of *conversion* and *renewal*, beginning on Ash Wednesday (March 5 in 2026) and culminating in Holy Week. Again, violet vestments and the omission of the *Gloria* and the *Alleluia* signal its muted, somber tone. Inspired by Jesus' 40 days in the desert (Matthew 4:1–11), the Church calls us to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. The *Ceremonial of Bishops* reminds us: "Lent prepares the faithful for the celebration of Easter through a spirit of repentance and renewal" (no. 249).

The Sacred Paschal Triduum—Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil—is the heart of the liturgical year. It commemorates the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ. Each day has its own liturgical color: white for Holy Thursday, red for Good Friday, and white/gold for the Vigil. "Christ our Passover has been sacrificed" (1 Corinthians 5:7) resounds in the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet). The Roman Missal emphasizes the unity of these days: "The Easter Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord is the culmination of the entire liturgical year."

Our Easter Season spans 50 days from the Vigil to Pentecost, a time of joyful celebration of the Resurrection and the birth of the Church. White vestments and the repeated singing of "Alleluia" mark its festivity. The Acts of the Apostles is central, narrating the early Church's witness. "He is not here; he has risen!" (Luke 24:6) is the Easter cry. The Church's Directory on Popular Piety encourages the faithful to live Easter "as a time of spiritual joy and renewal." Pentecost, the fiftieth day, celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit and the Church's mission. Red vestments symbolize the Spirit's fire. "They were all filled with the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:4) marks the beginning of the work of evangelization. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal notes: "Pentecost Sunday concludes the Easter season and celebrates the gift of the Spirit."

Ordinary Time (Part II) resumes after Pentecost, continuing the journey of discipleship. It includes solemnities like Corpus Christi and Christ the King, which deepen our Eucharistic and eschatological awareness. The green vestments remind us of ongoing growth in faith and charity.

Through these seasons, our Church not only remembers but *makes present* the saving mysteries of Christ. As Benedict XVI wrote, "The liturgical year is a journey with Christ through the mysteries of his life" (*Sacramentum Caritatis*, no. 61). Let's walk this path with reverence, joy, and renewed commitment to live as missionary disciples.
