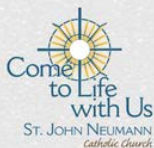

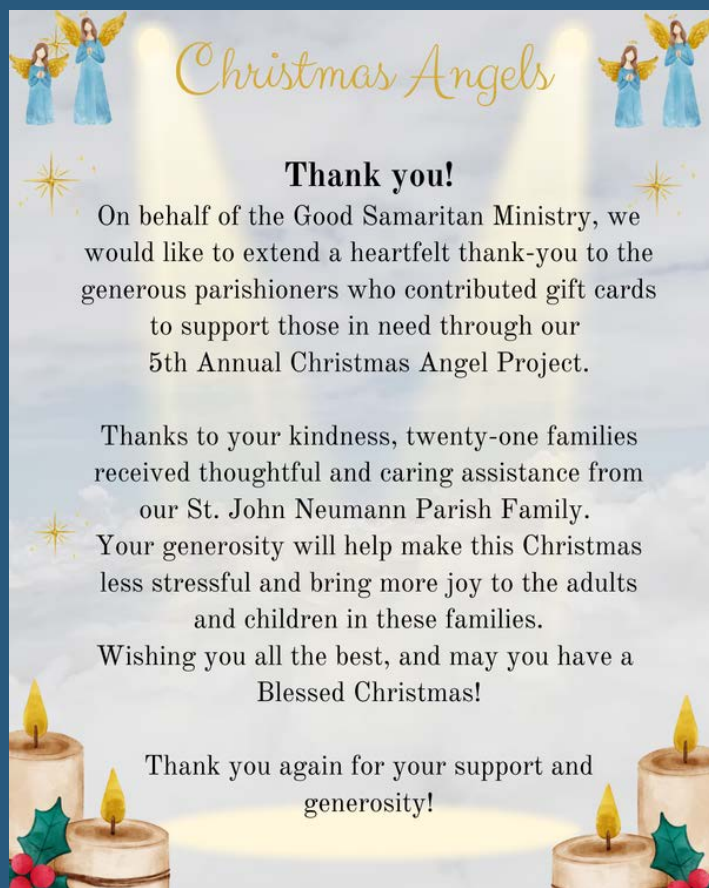

It's a Sensory Thing: Why Will We Use Incense?

When we leave our homes and comfort zones to assist at the Mass, we bring our entire selves along with us. God made us as embodied spirits. That means our spiritual life has a direct relationship with our physical selves, and how we interact with the created world. Just as we involve our created selves in relationships with others, we involve all of our senses in worship. One of the most striking sensory elements in our worship is incense. Its rising smoke and lingering fragrance aren't just decorative or nostalgic—they are deeply theological. Incense invites us to pray with our whole selves, to lift our hearts and minds through the body, and to enter into the mystery of God with reverence and awe.

In the Old Testament, God commanded Moses to build an altar of incense in the tabernacle, where Aaron would burn fragrant spices morning and evening as a perpetual offering (Exodus 30:7–8). The smoke symbolized the prayers of the people ascending to heaven. The Psalms echo this: "Let my prayer be counted as incense before you" (Ps. 141). In the Book of Revelation, heavenly worship is described with golden bowls full of incense, "which are the prayers of the saints" (5:8). From the beginning, incense signifies prayer, reverence, and divine presence. As the Church grew, it adopted incense into its liturgical life. By the fourth century, it was used in Christian worship, especially in the East. In the West, its use became more widespread in the medieval period, particularly in solemn liturgies. Today, incense remains a hallmark of sacred celebration, especially in the Latin Rite's more solemn forms. But what does incense mean for us, here and now?

First, incense is a sign of reverence. When the priest incenses the Altar, the Gospel book, the gifts, or the Assembly, he is marking them as *sacred*. The altar is the place of sacrifice. The Gospel is the revealed Word of God. The gifts will become the Body and Blood of Christ. The people are temples of the Holy Spirit. Incense honors these realities, not with words, but with gesture and fragrance. Second, incense is a symbol of prayer. As the smoke rises, it becomes a visible metaphor for our invisible longing for God. It reminds us that prayer is not only speech—it is surrender, offering, and presence. In a world of noise and distractions, incense *slows us down*. It creates space for silence, mystery, and contemplation. It lets us breathe in the sacred. Third, incense evokes the transcendent. It signals that something *extraordinary* is happening. The Mass is never a performance or a meeting—it is the *re-presentation of Christ's sacrifice*, the wedding of heaven and earth. Incense veils the sanctuary, hinting at the hidden presence of God. It recalls the cloud that filled the temple in Jerusalem, the cloud that descended on Mount Tabor, the cloud that led Israel through the desert. In this way, incense becomes a sacramental sign—a material reality which points to a spiritual truth.

Incense engages the human body at worship. Our liturgy is not disembodied; it involves standing, kneeling, signing, singing, and seeing. Smell, though less commonly invoked, is powerful. It touches memory, emotion, and imagination. The scents of incense can transport us to childhood liturgies, Easter Vigils, and funerals. It can awaken awe, longing, and presence. It reminds us that worship is not just about ideas—it is about *encounter*.

In the Latin Rite, incense is used optionally in most celebrations, but it remains a powerful tool for solemnity. The Church's guidelines suggest its use at the Entrance Procession, at the Altar, at the proclamation of the Gospel, the Preparation of the Gifts, and at the Elevation of the host and chalice. It may also be used at funerals, where the body of the deceased is incensed as a sign of honor and prayer. In Eucharistic Adoration, incense reverences the Blessed Sacrament, underscoring the real presence of Christ. The ritual of incensing itself has meaning. The thurible is swung in rhythmic patterns—three swings for the Blessed Sacrament, two for sacred images, one for the whole Assembly. The priest places grains of incense on burning charcoal, and fragrant smoke begins to rise. Each gesture is shaped by centuries of tradition, each movement a prayer.

Of course, incense is not universally appreciated. Some find it distracting; others have varying sensitivity to smoke. The Church, in her pastoral wisdom, allows for discretion. But even when not used, its symbolism remains part of our powerful liturgical imagination. It reminds us that worship is not merely functional—it is beautiful, mysterious, and embodied.

In a culture that often separates the spiritual from the physical, incense offers a corrective. It insists that the senses matter, that beauty matters, that worship is not just about thinking but being. It invites us to breathe deeply, to lift our hearts, to enter into the mystery. It is, in the words of Pope Benedict XVI, "a sign of the Church's prayer and of the presence of God." Ultimately, incense is a natural gift. It helps us pray, reverence, and remember. It draws us into the liturgy not as spectators but as participants. And when used well, it offers a glimpse of the Eternal—where prayers ascend, where angels and saints sing, and where God dwells.
