




Help us prepare homemade pies for our Lenten Fish Fries!

Come Early, Stay Late. (Or: Don't Become a “Dine-and-Dash Catholic!”)

For many Catholics, the temptation to slip out of Mass right after receiving Holy Communion is real. The thought process is simple enough: “I’ve received Jesus, so the most important part is done.” Yet the Church invites us to see the Eucharist not as a private moment but as the heart of a communal celebration that deserves our full presence from beginning to end. Staying until the final blessing isn’t just about “good manners”—it’s about living the fullness of the mystery we celebrate.

The Mass is not a series of disconnected rituals, but one unified act of worship. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that “the Eucharist is ‘the source and summit of the Christian life’” (CCC 1324). That summit is reached through the entire liturgy—beginning with the gathering of God’s people, the proclamation of the Word, the offering of gifts, the consecration, Communion, and finally the sending forth. To leave early is to miss the completion of the act of worship. Think of it like watching only the climax of a movie without the resolution. The Eucharist is indeed the climax, but the dismissal—“Go forth, the Mass is ended”—is the resolution, sending us into the world as missionary disciples. Without it, the story is incomplete.

The Bible consistently emphasizes perseverance and attentiveness in worship. In Acts 2:42, the early Christians are described as devoting themselves “to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.” Notice the word devoted—they didn’t rush through worship but gave themselves fully to it. Jesus Himself models this in the Last Supper. He doesn’t simply “break bread and leave;” He prays, teaches, and even concludes with a hymn (Matthew 26:30). The fullness of worship includes thanksgiving and sending forth. To imitate Christ is to remain until the end.

Receiving Holy Communion is not the finish line of Mass but the starting point of our mission. The Catechism explains: “The Eucharist commits us to the poor” (CCC 1397). In other words, Communion strengthens us to live as Christ’s body in the world. But that mission is formally given in the dismissal rite. The priest or deacon proclaims, “Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.” This is not a polite conclusion—it is our commissioning.

Leaving before the dismissal is like being sent on a mission, but walking out before receiving the instructions. The Church wants us to hear that call and respond with our lives. When we leave early, we unintentionally signal that our personal needs outweigh the communal act of worship. Paul warns against this attitude in 1 Corinthians 11:33, urging believers to “wait for one another” when they gather for the Lord’s Supper. Remaining until the end shows respect for the community gathered. It says: “I am part of this body, and I will stay with my brothers and sisters until we are sent forth together.”

Eucharist itself means “thanksgiving.” Gratitude takes time. After receiving Communion, the Church provides moments of silence, prayer, and song to let “these sacred Mysteries” sink in. The Eucharist is “an act of thanksgiving to God” (CCC 1360). To rush out immediately after Communion is to cut short that thanksgiving. Young adults especially know the value of slowing down in a fast-paced world. Staying until the end of Mass is in fact a countercultural act of patience and gratitude, allowing the gift of Christ’s presence to transform us.

Our actions at Mass are not invisible. Younger children, visitors, and even non-Catholics notice when people begin to leave early. Staying until the end is a witness of reverence. It says: “This is important. This is worth my time.” In Matthew 5:16, Jesus tells us to let our light shine before others. A simple and easy way to shine is by showing that the Eucharist deserves our full attention, not a hurried exit.

We’ve discussed the value of the priest’s final blessing before. It is not an option, but a real feature of the Mass. It is a real prayer of grace over the people. Blessings “sanctify certain ministries, states of life, and the various circumstances of Christian life” (CCC 1671). To miss the final blessing is to miss a gift of sanctification. Think of it as leaving a family meal before the host says goodbye. The blessing is Christ’s goodbye, His assurance of grace as we step back into daily life. Christ and His Church deserve far more than an “Irish Goodbye”!

Ultimately, staying until the end of Mass forms us in virtue, and teaches patience, reverence, and humility. It reminds us that worship is not about convenience but about offering ourselves fully to God. Romans 12:1 urges us to “present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.” Staying until the end is one small but powerful way to live that sacrifice.

So, next time you’re at Mass, resist the urge to slip out after Communion. Stay. Pray. Receive the blessing. And then go forth, sent as one of Christ’s disciples into the world. Because the fullness of the Mass is not just in receiving—it is in being sent.






